Amalgamation Update

Over the next two weeks two very important things will happen;

1. There will be community planning '**Focus Groups**' of parents, staff and students as we begin to plan for our new school. Discussions will be held around 'what will the move mean for my child/ren and our family' and 'what do we want Wiripaang Public School to look like, feel like and be like in 3 years time....'

This is a wonderful way to become involved in your community, your school and your child's life more, so come along and have some fun....

2. Uniforms

All students attending the school in 2013 should have a uniform order in by now. Each child received a \$50.00 credit towards establishing a new uniform set, with the ordering of a hat being compulsory. The school will opened on advertised days during the last week of the holidays so that parents may come and pick up uniform items in readiness for the first day of school. It will be exciting to see all of our students in full school uniform.

In 2013 we will be abiding by the 'no hat, no play' rule that is evident in the Sun Smart policy. Parents will be encouraged to make sure that their child/ren has a school hat for the day.

Grounds Maintenance Program

A grounds maintenance program will occur in the near future to prepare the current site for an opening as a new school. Expected building and maintenance programs may include;

- Refurbish of student toilets in the canteen block
- Exterior paint of Library
- Extension of cement line-up area and staircase access to front of canteen
- Formation of new sick bay and extension of a storeroom in admin block
- Creation of new entry to the school with widened pathways and covered walkways

Please note that work done around the school will not interfere with regular teaching programs and the majority of the work will happen in the school holidays.

Transport Survey

A transport survey has been issued to families to gather information about travel to school in 2013. This is necessary to gather information to investigate the need for bus transport for our students, particularly our new friends from Gateshead West. A bus education program will be implemented with children travelling on the bus with adult supervision and guidance being key features in establishing key safe and efficient journeys for our children. Students who bring disrepute to the school and their families with poor behavior on the bus will be suspended from the transport system as State Transit sees fit. Please return your surveys as soon as possible ...thanks.

In the near future each family will receive more up-to-date information, including map that outlines the options for transport to and from school, drop off zones, safe walk and ride to school procedures and parking options.
