Principal's Message

Dear Parents, Carers and Community,

The role of School Administration Manager has been recently advertised through the merit selection process. Kim Jones is the successful applicant in the process and will now substantially take up that position. Congratulations Kim...no introductions needed!

Enrolments in the school are increasing and we now have 207 students after many new faces joining us this term. This is good for the school as if we were to have numbers around this mark next year it would mean that we would qualify for extra days in the office and an extra day a fortnight for our General Assistant.

The Early Action for Success program that sees our K-2 teachers being offered mentorship and our students offered speech therapy has had end of Term 3 data presented. There were significant improvements in reading skills across the K-2 area of the school and explicit teaching is more evident in our classrooms. K-2 network meetings (Wiripaang, Windale, and Mount Hutton) aim to share the success and allow teachers professional development in specific strategies that will enhance explicit teaching. It is evident that our teachers are inspired and our students are learning! The other significant factor is the real value of the speech therapy program....it's really helping our students.

Our Mini–Soaring High Day changed direction yesterday when our best laid plans were marred by the rain. It was wonderful to see so many children achieve that goal and the relationship the P&C has with the students in supplying them a 'yummy' reward lunch....thanks so much P&C! Students who do not qualify for 'Mini Soaring High Day' were guided in filling in 'Goal Setting' sheet, working on strategies to improve their behaviour in readiness for the next five weeks. We are always working to help our children improve their behaviour at school.

Our positive affirmation this week is 'I follow instructions so that I can learn'. This affirmation is about *you as a learner*. Everyone in life is a learner. We never stop learning, but as a young student, you need to understand that you are being given opportunities to learn things every day at school that will help set you up for a successful life. Things like learning how to comprehend what you are reading, your times tables, how to do subtraction, how to take turns, how to use fractions....there is so much to learn and when you listen and follow instructions, you will learn.

Work on 'Lakeside Playground' is coming to completion and there is new fencing in place. The new car park will be for parents and community as of day one 2014. From this day there will be no parent/community access to our top staff car park... we will be opening it up to HSHS staff who are in desperate need. Our special needs buses will use the new drop off zone. The new drop off zone will be supervised from 8.40am–9am each morning and 3.00pm-3.15pm each afternoon. All children will play in the new 'Lakeside Playground' in the morning session next year (8.40am-9am). During the holidays the gates will be numbered to avoid confusion. It's exciting to know we will be expanding in 2014!

It is lovely to see almost all students in the school with a hat on their head...well done! It's a good idea to remind your child/ren as they leave the house/car of a morning..."have you got your hat?" as we are encouraging students to take responsibility for bringing and wearing a hat.

Sport News

The Premier's Primary School Sport Challenges (PSC)

The Premier's Sport Challenge involves all students from Wiripaang Primary School participating in a 10 week sport and physical activity challenge. The Challenge aims to engage young people in sport and physical activity and encourages them to lead healthy, active lifestyles.

The Challenge encourages all students to increase their physical activity levels in sport and physical activity. The Challenge enables us to promote and celebrate student achievement through participation in well planned sport and physical activity programs. Wiripaang School provides an ideal setting for students to engage in physical activities that are safe, challenging, age appropriate and in a fair and positive learning environment.

The Challenge is class based. All class members contribute the time they spend in physical activity each week. Classes are challenged to set goals to accrue time each week in moderate to vigorous activity.

Activities have included: playground games, morning fitness dance, organised school sport, dance – songroom/Dance2bfit, physical education lessons, Swimming Scheme, Soaring High mini-days, Jump Rope for Heart, multi-sports day, gymnastics and in class physical activities, and community sport and recreation activities. Students have also included incidental home activities such as washing the car to add to their points.



Students work together to achieve award goals for the class and record their time in log books. Teachers record time on class activity summary card and record the number of Diamond, Gold, Silver or Bronze awards achieved at the end of 5 weeks and then again at the end of ten weeks.

To achieve a Premier's Bronze, Silver, Gold or Diamond award classes and individuals must accrue the following time in sport or physical activity.

Bronze = 30 minutes a day or 210 minutes per week

Silver = 45 minutes a day or 315 minutes per week.

Gold = 60 minutes a day or 420 minutes per week.

Diamond = 80 minutes a day or 560 minutes per week.



All students who complete the 10 weeks of physical activity time will receive a Premier's Primary School Sport Challenge Award Certificate. Students in Infant classes, WF and WS will receive a Gold certificate to encourage and acknowledge the work of individuals and class.

In our Year 3/6 classes, there will be 23 receiving bronze, 24 receiving silver, 40 students who achieved gold and 12 students receiving Diamond awards. Well done to all students.
