Drive into the Lakeside entrance, drop your child/ren under the carport and then continue driving through to the exit near the hospital car park. The new car park will be for parents and community. There will be no parent/community access to our top staff car park... we will be opening it up to HSHS staff who are in desperate need. Our special needs buses will use new drop off zone. The new drop off zone will be supervised from 8.40am-9am each morning and 3.00pm-3.15pm each afternoon. All children will play in the new 'Lakeside Playground' in the morning session. (8.40am-9am).

As this will be the last bulletin for the year I would like to thank the staff of this school who have, quite frankly, worked so hard this year to establish a new and exciting school. I'm sure that it does not go unnoticed the 'above and beyond' that is given in this school. When Breakfast Club opens - so have no fear.



Soaring High Day


