



### Members of our community have indicated a need for a cheaper alternative for our school shirt.

Currently we order our school shirts through Alinta. The current school shirts look fabulous but are a hard colour to emulate with other companies. After careful consideration; the P&C have had a sample made up by Kombat Sportswear, who currently provide our Sports Shirts. This design is the same as the current design but has all colours, piping and logo sublimated INTO the shirt. Keeping in mind that some of our children have sensory issues, having the shirt like this means minimal seams and embroidery to annoy any of the children.

- The current shirt cost to you is \$33 and takes 6 months from order to receive.
- The new shirt will cost to you \$25 and takes 6/8 weeks to order to receive.

The new sample has a black button panel on the front; this WON'T be the case on the school shirts; it WILL be teal like the rest of the shirt.

## KIDS FISHING WORKSHOP

Give your child the opportunity to learn to fish during the school holidays. The day involves fishing techniques such as knots and rigging as well as casting, bag/size limits and ethical fishing practices. The workshop is designed for kids aged 8-14 years.

#### \$40 per child
