



I can control my feelings



This term our PBL lessons focus on strengthening our resiliency skills. Resiliency refers to our ability to be able to bounce back or recover from minor difficulties quickly and thoroughly when they occur. Each fortnight we are sharing elements from weekly lessons that you may like to try as a family at home.

Creating calm: Developing the habit of thinking about your own behaviour and the behaviours of others and being able to control your emotions

# At home activity:

Wondering how you can build you child's resilience? Try this at home activity to get you started

Discuss and brainstorm.

What makes you angry?" "How do we look when we are angry?" "How does our body look and feel when we are angry?" (Think about red face, sweaty palms, tense muscles, crying, yelling)

*Brainstorm* positive ways of calming/cooling down when you are angry. (Eg. Walk away, get a drink, take deep breaths, count to 10, draw, read, tell a friend, tal

(Eg. Walk away, get a drink, take deep breaths, count to 10, draw, read, tell a friend, talk about the problem, squeeze your muscles then relax them.)

# Keeping our mathematics skills sharp using games.




